Operational and Financial Update

Marcellus Operations:

- Currently operating five drilling rigs in northeast Pennsylvania and expect to drop one rig in the Marcellus in the third quarter
- Currently have one completions crew operating in the Marcellus, but plans to maintain one to two frac crews throughout the year
- Track record of consistently growing in-basin production ~120% growth over the last five years
- Peer-leading gathering rates in Northeast and ample access to all three interstate pipelines in the area

The company's operating plan remains flexible and is prepared for further adjustments, higher or lower, should market conditions change materially.

Answering the Call for Affordable, Reliable, Lower Carbon Energy

Current global events have placed energy production at the center of our national conversation. Chesapeake is proud of the role we play in powering Pennsylvania and America, and we believe natural gas production from Pennsylvania will play a vital role in worldwide energy security. We are producing ~4.4 billion cubic feet per day of natural gas in the Marcellus — enough to power 9 million homes a day using natural gas produced by Chesapeake's northeast PA operations. The fuel we produce is helping to power our homes and businesses, and greatly lessen our nation's dependence on foreign sources of fuel. Your constituents are seeing the benefits of Marcellus Shale production every day in the form of lower natural gas costs and increased royalty payments to landowners, and our employees are playing an active role in your communities by volunteering for numerous organizations.

ROYALTY OWNER UPDATE

As we discussed earlier this year, Chesapeake and its affiliates have reached comprehensive settlements with the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General and in-class actions brought on behalf of oil and gas lessors in Pennsylvania for these cases:

- PA Attorney General: Commonwealth of Pennsylvania v. Chesapeake Energy Corporation, et al.
- Market Enhancement Clause: Demchak Partners Limited Partnership, et al. v. Chesapeake Appalachia, L.L.C.
- **Non-Market Enhancement Clause:** Brown v. Access Midstream Partners, L.P., et al. and The Suessenbach Family Limited Partnership v. Access Midstream Partners, L.P.

ESG UPDATE

In 2022, Chesapeake achieved independent responsibly sourced gas certification across all of its natural gas assets under a combination of the MiQ methane standard, the EO100™ Standard for Responsible Energy Development and Project Canary's TrustWell certification process. Chesapeake is the first producer to achieve certification for produced and marketed gas volumes across two industry leading gas plays, delivering approximately 6 bcf per day of the premium commodity.



Strengthening Our Company Through Sustainability

- Installed more than 2,000 methane monitoring devices across our assets and retrofitted more than 19,000 pneumatic devices
- Conducting aerial Gas Mapping LiDAR scans to detect emissions across all assets
- Reduced GHG and methane intensity by more than 50% since 2020
- Interim targets lowered to 3.0 GHG intensity and 0.02% methane intensity by 2025⁽¹⁾
- Targeting net zero GHG emissions by 2035
- Leverage existing expertise to adjacent CCS and geothermal projects with minimal upfront but impactful capital
- Allocate capital to meaningful emission abatement and potential revenue creating projects
